## Nicholas Mangiaracina



Nicholas A. Mangiaracina, age 60, of Winter, WI passed away on Saturday, February 16, 2008 at St. Mary's Hospital in Duluth, MN.

Nick was born July 27, 1947 in Chicago, IL the son of Nicholas and Dawn (Fristoe) Mangiaracina. He attended Maternity B.V.M. and graduated from Weber High School in 1965. He served in the U.S. Army in Vietnam from 1966 to 1968. After returning home, he began working for AT&T in Chicago, IL and Minneapolis, MN as a Communication Technician.
