For instance, did you know that your tax dollars may be paying for work that's sent to lowest-bid contractors in other states or other countries, instead of creating good, stable jobs that would boost our economy? Many of the companies we patronize choose to empty out their offices and call centers instead of reinvesting in middle-class jobs that help sustain our communities.

In Florida, a state that has lost 277,000 jobs since 2001, Ocwen Financial Corp. has outsourced so many jobs that it now employs more people in Bangalore, India, than it does at its headquarters in Palm Beach.

Ohio sends public records, including veterans' records and birth records to countries whose privacy laws are much less strict than the U.S.'

The New Mexico Department of Labor outsourced the system for applying for unemployment insurance in a state with an 5.4% unemployment rate.

In Washington state, \$3.6 million worth of work for the Department of Corrections is being performed outside the U.S. by IBM.

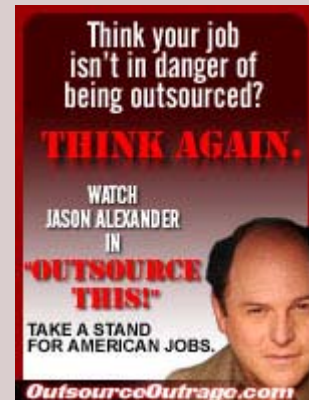
